- Welcoming, family involved, community-integrated, vibrant, respectful, culturally responsive atmosphere

OVERVIEW

- Renovate existing properties to create new residential centers closer to youths' communities of origin • Reduce use of secure custody as a response Invest in community-based intensive wraparound
- services



- DJJ moves out of adult-style prison-like facilities
- Adult-style facilities repurposed by IDOC

BENEFITS

- Reduce the harm of incarceration on youth
- Implement best practice in juvenile justice for better outcomes
- Realigns spending to invest in communities most impacted by disinvestment, racism, and violence
- Advances mission of IDJJ and IDOC in cost-effective way



 Allows youth to remain closer to home with increased access to family
